# Access courses designed for adults

Access to Higher Education Diploma courses are recognised by all universities and provide a solid foundation in the knowledge and skills required for studying at university level, so that students are confident and well prepared when they go on to higher education. Many of our students have successfully completed their course and gained access to institutes including Russell Group universities to further their studies.

Our Access to Higher Education Diploma courses are also Level 3 (see page 9). These courses are designed to help you get into university if you don't already have the right qualifications. Despite being classed as 'Advanced Learning', these courses don't necessarily require previous experience or qualifications, although most courses require a GCSE or a Level 2 in English and occasionally in maths and a commitment to hard work.


# Join us in making history

Morley College London was founded over 130 years ago. Thanks to the vision of Emma Cons and Samuel Morley, our college provides lifelong educational opportunities for diverse communities throughout London.

Emma Cons was an artist, social reformer, and suffragette. She was determined to improve the prospects of the local working community and started lectures for the cost of 1p at what is now known as The Old Vic.

Wool manufacturer and Liberal MP Samuel Morley was a vocal abolitionist and social reformer. He died in 1886 and bequeathed funds to Emma to set up the adult education college she was developing. Morley College was then established in Waterloo in 1889. In 2020, we expanded to serve the communities of North Kensington and Chelsea.

Our Access to Higher Education programmes are predominantly based in our Waterloo and North Kensington buildings, stemming off this rich history.

# What Level?

Your qualifications are measured in levels. Identifying where you are helps to work out the routes you can take in your chosen vocation, and what level you need to achieve for the job you want. If you don't have any formal qualification, an assessment will match you to the right course.

For beginners to gain basic knowledge and skills.

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**L1**

**Level 1**

To gain basic knowledge of jobs, business and industry. L1 is pre GCSE. Puts you on the path to a vocational qualification.

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**L2**

**Level 2 Intermediate**

Courses include diverse range of activities. Certificates and Diplomas for this qualification.

L2 Certificate is 2 GCSEs. L2 Diploma is 4 GCSEs.

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**L3**

**Level 3 Advanced  
Access to Higher Education**

Prepares you for work and higher education. More challenge, development of skills and subject knowledge. L3 Certificate is 1 A-Level, L3 Diploma is 1.5 A-levels.

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**L4**

**L5**

**Level 4 & 5  
Higher Education**

Equivalent to the first two years of a degree. Specialist qualification that helps move you into leadership and management.

The Higher National Certificate (HNC) is Level 4.

The Higher National Diploma (HND) is Level 5.

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**L6**

**Level 6**

Equivalent to a degree, with or without honours.

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**L7**

**Level 7**

In-depth professional knowledge, including master's degrees, postgraduate or professional certificates or diplomas.

## National Skills Fund


From April 2021, any adult aged 24 and over who wants to achieve their first full Level 3 qualification which is relevant to an advanced technical certificate or diploma, or two full A levels, will be able to access a number of fully funded courses. Search 'natskifun' at [morleycollege.ac.uk](http://morleycollege.ac.uk) for a list of eligible courses.

# Advanced Learner Loan

The Advanced Learner Loan is operated by the government and can help cover the cost of your tuition fees on an Advanced Learning course. It is not means-tested and doesn't require credit checks. You don't have to apply for the full amount, and the loan doesn't become repayable until you start earning over £27,295. If you use it to pay for an Access to Higher Education Diploma and go on to university-level study, the remaining balance on the loan will be written off once you complete your higher education course.

Repayments start the April after you complete or withdraw from your course. You pay back your loan (plus interest) when you finish your course and earn more than £27,295 a year. Your repayments will stop if your income drops below £27,295 a year.

Your annual repayment amount will be 9% of any income earned over £27,295. Your repayments automatically stop if you stop working or your income goes below the threshold.



# Law

## Access to HE Diploma: Law

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**Centre:** North Kensington  
**Cost:** full fee and concession £3,022

This diploma covers a wide range of areas within law such as tort, contract and criminal law and a module in sociology in preparation for degree level with a strong focus on core modules required at university. You will also study the English legal system and take part in mock trials in units such as the trial process. The course equips students with the tools needed to study law at undergraduate level by developing legal research skills, improving their essay writing, examination and note taking techniques through study skills.

### Following this course

You could progress to a higher education course, a degree in law and other similar undergraduate programmes. Many students continue to read law at prestigious universities such as SOAS, Cambridge, King's and Exeter.

### Entry requirements

GCSE English grades A-C / 4-9 or Level 2 equivalent, and GCSE maths grades A-C / 4-9 or Level 2 equivalent is desirable.

# Humanities & Social Sciences

## Access to HE Diploma: Humanities and Social Sciences

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**Centre:** North Kensington  
**Cost:** full fee and concession £3,022

In this course, you will study core modules in politics and international relations, sociology, and law, as well as study skills, which will enable you to develop the essential skills you will need to be a successful student at university. You will receive extensive support throughout the course, including guidance around all aspects of your university application.

### Following this course

You could progress to study for a sociology, history, politics and internal relations, development studies and other similar undergraduate programmes.

### Entry requirements

GCSE English grades A-C / 4-9 or Level 2 equivalent, and GCSE maths grades A-C / 4-9 or Level 2 equivalent is desirable. You will need these two qualifications in addition to the Access to HE Diploma to progress to most university undergraduate programmes.

## Access to HE Diploma: Humanities

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**Centres:** North Kensington and Waterloo

**Cost:** full fee and concession £3,022

The humanities diploma programme is the most suitable route for you if you are looking to go on to study a degree in subjects such as history, politics, international relations and/or development studies, sociology, and criminology. You will study core modules in study skills, which will enable you to develop the essential skills you will need to be a successful student at university, along with three modules, namely, politics, history and sociology. You will receive extensive support throughout the course, including guidance around all aspects of your university application.

### Following this course

You could progress to study for a degree in politics and internal relations, global humanitarian studies, human geography, development studies and other similar undergraduate programmes.

### Entry requirements

GCSE English grades A-C / 4-9 or Level 2 equivalent, and GCSE maths grades A-C / 4-9 or Level 2 equivalent is desirable. You will need these two qualifications in addition to the Access to HE Diploma to progress to most university undergraduate programmes.

## Access to HE Diploma: Social Science

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**Centre:** North Kensington

**Cost:** full fee and concession £3,022

You will study core modules in study skills, which will enable you to develop the essential skills you will need to be a successful student at university, along with a choice of three modules namely, anthropology, psychology, and sociology. You will receive extensive support throughout the course, including guidance around all aspects of your university application.

### Following this course

You could progress to study for a degree in psychology, sociology, anthropology, youth studies, working with families and young people, criminology, sociology and social policy or other similar undergraduate programmes.

### Entry requirements

GCSE English grades A-C / 4-9 or Level 2 equivalent, and GCSE maths grades A-C / 4-9 or Level 2 equivalent is desirable. You will need these two qualifications in addition to the Access to HE Diploma to progress to most university undergraduate programmes.

# Arts & Humanities

## Access to HE: Arts and Humanities

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**Centre:** North Kensington

**Cost:** full fee and concession £3,022

You will study core modules in study skills, which will enable you to develop the essential skills you will need to be a successful student at university, along with a choice of three modules namely, English literature, history, and psychology. You will receive extensive support throughout the course, including guidance around all aspects of your university application. Achievement on your course will be measured by completion of assignments / portfolio which will be reviewed throughout the course with regular individual tutorials with your tutor to discuss your personal goals and coursework submission with high grades. You will be given help and guidance with the university application process.

### Following this course

You could progress to study for a degree in psychology, journalism, media/film studies, history or other similar undergraduate programmes.

### Entry requirements

GCSE English grades A-C / 4-9 or Level 2 equivalent , and GCSE maths grades A-C / 4-9 or Level 2 equivalent is desirable You will need these two qualifications in addition to the Access to HE Diploma to progress to most university undergraduate programmes.

## Access to HE Diploma: Africana Studies

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**Centre:** North Kensington

**Cost:** full fee and concession £3,022

This pathway is intended for students who wish to study African and Caribbean and/or anthropology at university but do not have the required entry qualifications. The course equips students with the tools needed to study Africana studies at undergraduate level by developing research and critical thinking skills, improving their essay writing, examination and note taking techniques through study skills. Students will be supported through the university application process. Achievement on your course will be measured by completion of assignments / portfolio which will be reviewed throughout the course with regular individual tutorials with your tutor to discuss your personal goals and coursework submissions.

### Following this course

You could progress to university to study many subjects at degree level, including politics, social science and culture, geography and history. This can lead to a career working for governmental and non-governmental organisations, both nationally and internationally.

### Entry requirements

GCSE English grades A-C / 4-9 or Level 2 equivalent, and GCSE maths grades A-C / 4-9 or Level 2 equivalent is desirable. You will need these two qualifications in addition to the Access to HE Diploma to progress to most university undergraduate programmes.

# Science

## Access to HE Diploma in Science (Science)

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**Centre:** North Kensington

**Cost:** full fee and concession £3,384

If you are interested in science, this course could be a great first step towards launching your career in either science or engineering. This programme provides a thorough grounding in scientific principles and practical skills in preparation for a wide range of science-based degrees, such as biomedical sciences, biochemistry, ecology, chemistry, pharmaceutical science, physics, civil, mechanical, electronic or chemical engineering, or earth science. You will also develop your practical skills, making use of the state-of-the-art science laboratories at our North Kensington centre, scheduled to be completed in 2022.

### Following this course

Past students have gained access to a wide range of science degrees at excellent universities, including: veterinary science (Royal Veterinary College), chemistry (St. George's) physics (UCL) marine biology (Portsmouth) and ecology (Lancaster).

### Entry requirements

GCSE maths and English at grade A-C / 4-9. You also need to have studied science at Level 2 (GCSE level). In some cases, we will accept a Level 2 equivalent qualification (such as functional skills) but this will depend on your progression intention, as some universities will not accept GCSE equivalent qualifications. For non-native English speakers, an IELTS 6.5/7 is required, with not less than 6.0 in each of the sub-tests.

## Access to HE Diploma: Science (Pharmacy and Biomedical Sciences)

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**Centre:** North Kensington

**Cost:** full fee and concession £3,384

The qualification has a focus on biomedical science and pharmacology, providing you with the relevant academic subject knowledge needed for progression to higher education study within these disciplines, You will also develop your practical skills, making use of the state-of-the-art science laboratories at our North Kensington Centre, scheduled to be completed in 2022.

### Following this course

Past students have gained access to a wide range of science degrees at excellent universities, including: veterinary science (Royal Veterinary College), biomedical science (Westminster, Kent & Royal Holloway) nutrition and dietetics (Kings College, St Mary's, Hertfordshire & Surrey) and chemistry (St. George's).

### Entry requirements

GCSE maths and English at grade A-C / 4-9. You also need to have studied science at Level 2 (GCSE level). In some cases, we will accept a Level 2 equivalent qualification (such as functional skills) but this will depend on your progression intention, as some universities will not accept GCSE equivalent qualifications. For non-native English speakers, an IELTS 6.5/7 is required, with not less than 6.0 in each of the sub-tests.

## Access to HE Diploma: Science (Paramedic Science)

**Centre:** North Kensington

**Cost:** full fee and concession £3,384

This course is a fantastic first step for students who wish to progress on to degrees in paramedic science, paramedic practice and paramedicine. Paramedics are usually the first healthcare professionals on the scene at emergency situations and provide immediate response to deal with injuries.

### Following this course

Past students have gone on to successfully study paramedic science at universities including: Greenwich, Bedfordshire, Hertfordshire and Angela Ruskin.

### Entry requirements

GCSE maths and English at grade A-C / 4-9. You also need to have studied science at Level 2 (GCSE level). In some cases, we will accept a Level 2 equivalent qualification (such as functional skills) but this will depend on your progression intention, as some universities will not accept GCSE equivalent qualifications. For non-native English speakers, an IELTS 6.5/7 is required, with not less than 6.0 in each of the sub-tests.

## Access to HE Diploma: Science (Radiography)

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**Centre:** North Kensington

**Cost:** full fee and concession £3,384

This course is suitable for students with a wide range of educational or career experiences who now wish to pursue further study in science. The radiography route is an intensive programme that will provide you with the foundation knowledge required to progress onto further study in the field of diagnostic and therapeutic radiography.

### Following this course

Past students have gone on to successfully study radiography at universities including London South Bank, Cardiff, Canterbury Christ Church, Hertfordshire, Birmingham, St. George's and Salford as well as degrees in radiography with oncology and physics.

### Entry requirements

GCSE maths and English at grade A-C / 4-9. You also need to have studied science at Level 2 (GCSE level). In some cases, we will accept a Level 2 equivalent qualification (such as functional skills) but this will depend on your progression intention, as some universities will not accept GCSE equivalent qualifications. For non-native English speakers, an IELTS 6.5/7 is required, with not less than 6.0 in each of the sub-tests.

## Access to HE: Science (Sports Science route)

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**Centre:** North Kensington

**Cost:** full fee and concession £3,384

This qualification covers a wide breadth of subject areas such as human skeletal and muscular systems, fitness and training, sports injuries and treatment, sports psychology, diet and nutrition and applied sports coaching. After successful completion, this course allows students to follow many related pathways including sports psychology, exercise physiology, sports nutrition and sports therapy.

### Following this course

Past students have gained access to a wide range of science degrees at excellent universities, including physiotherapy (King's College, St. George's, LSBU and East London), sport and exercise Medical Sciences (King's College), performance analysis and coaching science (Derby), strength and conditioning science (St. Mary's), sports performance analysis and talent identification (St. Mary's) and nutrition and dietetics (Kings College, St Mary's, Hertfordshire & Surrey).

### Entry requirements

GCSE maths and English at grade A-C / 4-9. You also need to have studied science at Level 2 (GCSE level). In some cases, we will accept a Level 2 equivalent qualification (such as functional skills) but this will depend on your progression intention, as some universities will not accept GCSE equivalent qualifications. For non-native English speakers, an IELTS 6.5/7 is required, with not less than 6.0 in each of the sub-tests.

## Simeon's Story

Simeon grew up in Ladbrooke Grove, North Kensington. When he left school at 16, he felt he didn't have many options, so taking a low-level job in a restaurant was something he could do. He worked his way up from a job peeling potatoes to becoming the head chef at one of London's finest restaurants. But he wasn't happy.

Since he loves sports, he enrolled at Morley College London's Access to Sports Science course. Now, a little over a year later, the 35-year-old father of two is studying at King's College London and achieving his dream of becoming a sports therapist or nutritionist.

“I understand what it's like to be injured and be away from your sport and the detrimental effects it can have on your mental health and your wellbeing and to allow people to get past that with my help, that is the main goal.”

Simeon wanted to go directly into the Access to Sports Science course. “I didn't have the grades, so I had to go back and do my maths and my English as well. I had to raise my standards to get onto the course. I had to get a GCSE equivalent of a grade C (now a grade 4).”

# Health & Social Care

## Access to HE: Nursing and Midwifery

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**Centre:** North Kensington  
**Cost:** full fee and concession £3,384

This is an intensive programme that will provide you with the foundation knowledge of human anatomy and physiology required to work in the healthcare profession. The course offers an equal balance of theory and practice when learning about nursing and midwifery practice. You will also learn important study skills relevant to studying a science degree, including undertaking effective research, collecting and analysing scientific data and writing experiment reports and essays.

### Following this course

You could progress onto a degree programme at university or other higher education provider. Once you have your degree, you could work in nursing and branch out to a range of specialist career paths, such as health visitor, oncology nurse, substance abuse nurse, community psychiatric nurse or midwifery consultant.

### Entry requirements

GCSE maths and English at grade A-C / 4-9. You also need to have studied science at Level 2 (GCSE level). In some cases, we will accept a Level 2 equivalent qualification (such as functional skills) but this will depend on your progression intention, as some universities will not accept GCSE equivalent qualifications. For non-native English speakers, an IELTS 6.5/7 is required, with not less than 6.0 in each of the sub-tests.

## Access to HE Diploma: Science (Health and Human Sciences)

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**Centre:** North Kensington  
**Cost:** full fee and concession £3,384

The qualification is an intensive programme designed to provide students with the foundation knowledge of the healthcare profession, human anatomy and physiology. The course will equip you with the relevant academic subject knowledge needed for higher education study and the opportunity to develop study skills to help you to succeed. It offers an equal balance of theory and practice when learning about careers in healthcare. You will also develop your practical skills, making use of the state-of-the-art science laboratories at our North Kensington Centre, scheduled to be completed in 2022.

### Following this course

You could progress to a degree programme at university or any higher education study. Once you have a degree you could work in a huge range of professions within the health and human sciences fields.

### Entry requirements

You also need GCSE maths and English at grade A-C / 4-9. You also need to have studied science at Level 2 (GCSE level). In some cases, we will accept a Level 2 equivalent qualification (such as functional skills) but this will depend on your progression intention, as some universities will not accept GCSE equivalent qualifications.

## Access to HE: Science (Health and Social Care)

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**Centre:** North Kensington

**Cost:** full fee and concession £3,384

This route will provide you with the foundation knowledge of a range of healthcare professions. The course offers an equal balance of theory and practice when learning about careers in healthcare. You will learn important study skills relevant to science, including undertaking effective research, collecting and analysing scientific data and writing experiment reports and essays. Additional modules will help you develop your study and research skills and assist with your personal development for further study.

### Following this course

You could progress to a degree programme at university or any higher education study. Once you have a degree you could work in branches of nursing (adult, children, mental health or learning disability) and then branch out into a range of specialist career paths, such as health visitor, oncology nurse, substance abuse nurse, community psychiatric nurse, midwifery consultant, research and management, smoking cessation counselling and specialist midwifery in teenage pregnancy or hiv. Other previous graduates have gone on to work in children's centres or become consultant midwives.

### Entry requirements

You also need GCSE maths and English at grade A-C / 4-9. You also need to have studied science at Level 2 (GCSE level). In some cases, we will accept a Level 2 equivalent qualification (such as functional skills) but this will depend on your progression intention, as some universities will not accept GCSE equivalent qualifications.

## Diploma in Health and Human Sciences (Pre-Access) (Level 2)

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**Centre:** North Kensington

**Cost:** full fee and concession £1,044


This course is designed for adults (19+) with a keen interest in the study of health and social care who lack the English and maths required to enrol on a course at Level 3. This programme is designed to support you to develop the skills and knowledge needed for progression to further learning on Level 3 qualifications, including Access to Higher Education Diplomas in health and human science related subjects. You will also learn important study skills relevant to studying science, including undertaking effective research, collecting and analysing scientific data and writing experiment reports and essays all of which will prepare you well for further study.

### Following this course

You could progress to a Level 3 Access to Higher Education Diploma in your chosen area.

### Entry requirements

You will need GCSE maths and English at grade 2 or above. By the end of the course, you will need to have achieved GCSE maths and English at grade 4 or above. Therefore, if you have a grade 2 or 3 in either or both subjects, you will need to agree to attend GCSE resit classes alongside your vocational course.

## Fatmata’s Story

Fatmata’s journey in becoming a nurse has been a long and challenging one.

Originally from Sierra Leone, Fatmata came to live in the UK 12 years ago when she married her husband.

Since enrolling in Morley College London, Fatmata has juggled her studies with life as a mother of three children (she gave birth to her youngest as a student) and work as a care assistant.

She’s very thankful for the support that Morley and its tutors and staff have given her. Without the childcare facilities Morley supplies, she never would have been able to study as a working mother.

Fatmata has completed many courses at Morley, including maths, English, and health and social care to get herself ready to take Morley’s gateway to a nursing degree — the Access to HE Diploma: Nursing, Midwifery and Health.

She is now studying Nursing at university and is enjoying it.

“I think nursing is a very rewarding job,” says Fatmata. “To be honest, I don’t look at the money side, I look at the joy it brings out more than anything and being able to help someone who can’t help themselves and hearing their thank yous ... that’s more valuable to me. I’m happy to be on that journey.”

# Counselling

## Access to HE Diploma: Counselling

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**Centre:** North Kensington

**Cost:** full fee and concession £3,384

Our diploma courses lead to nationally recognised qualifications that enable successful students to progress onto degree level study at university. The psychology and counselling diploma programme is the most suitable route for you if you are looking to go on to study a degree in subjects such as psychology, psychology with counselling, counselling and psychotherapy, education with psychology, sociology, criminology, psychology with professional development or such other similar subjects. This pathway will enable you to gain a solid introduction especially in the field of counselling, study key counselling methods such as CBT and transactional analysis and also develop the skills you will need to become a successful counsellor.

### Following this course

You could progress to university to study psychology, psychology with counselling, counselling and psychotherapy, education with psychology, sociology, criminology, psychology with professional development or such other similar subjects.

### Entry requirements

GCSE English grades A-C / 4-9 or Level 2 equivalent, and GCSE maths grades A-C / 4-9 or Level 2 equivalent is desirable. You will need these two qualifications in addition to the Access to HE Diploma to progress to most university undergraduate programmes.

# Business and IT & Computing

## Access to HE Diploma: Digital Technologies in Business Management

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**Centre:** North Kensington

**Cost:** full fee and concession £3,022

By the end of this diploma course, you will have gained skills in management and leadership and learned about business organisations and structure, mobile technology business financing. You will have received an introduction to social media and gained knowledge in e-commerce, emerging and future digital technologies in business management, mobile technology and business financing.

### Following this course

You could progress to higher education study in areas related to digital technologies and business management. These may include some of the following areas of degree level study: business management and digital technology, business management, digital business, digital and technology solutions, digital marketing, digital technology and a wide range of combined and related degrees.

### Entry requirements

There is usually the expectation that the learner will have literacy, communication skills and numeracy at Level 2 or above. You will be assessed in literacy and numeracy at the centre to ensure you are able to access the programme. You would need to achieve 4 GCSEs at Grade 4 and above (old C) including maths and English (language or literature). If you are accepted into this course without a grade 4 (old grade C) or above in maths and/or English, you will be expected to retake. This will be compulsory part of your timetable.

## Certificate in Skills for Professions in Business Administration and Finance (Pre-Access) (Level 2)

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**Centre:** North Kensington

**Cost:** full fee and concession £1,044

The OCNLR Level 1 Award and Certificate in Skills for Professions in Business, Administration and Finance has been designed to provide learners with the underpinning skills and knowledge required to progress to further study in business, administration and finance and ultimately to work in these or other related sectors.

### Following this course

On completion of the qualification, learners will have the required skills and knowledge in order to progress to the OCNLR level 2 qualifications in skills for professions in business, administration and finance or to other vocational qualifications at level 2. Alternatively, learners may progress to employment in entry level roles within business, administration and finance settings.

### Entry requirements

Pre-GCSE Level — You need to have achieved English/literacy at Level 1 and maths/numeracy at Level 1. You will be assessed in literacy and numeracy at the centre to ensure you are able to access the programme.

# Music

## Access to HE Diploma: Music

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**Centre:** North Kensington  
**Cost:** full fee and concession £3,384

The Access to Higher Education Diploma (Music) prepares individuals without traditional qualifications for study at university. The qualification gives you the relevant academic knowledge and creative skills needed for music higher education study, and the opportunity to develop study skills to help you to succeed. You will be offered a coherent, integrated and supported year of study through which you will gain the knowledge, awareness, skills and confidence necessary for successful undergraduate study in a range of music-related progression routes

### Following this course

You could progress to higher education study in areas related to music. These may include academic music, music performance, composition, music industry studies and a range of combined and related degrees.

### Entry requirements

GCSE maths and English at grade C/4. You may be able to study these GCSEs alongside the Access to HE Diploma. The college may ask you to sit an English and, in some cases, a maths diagnostic test. You may be asked for an interview as part of the application process.

## Access to HE Diploma: Music Technology

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**Centre:** North Kensington  
**Cost:** full fee and concession £4,835

The Access to Higher Education Diploma (Music Technology) prepares people without traditional qualifications for study at university. The qualification gives you the relevant academic knowledge and creative skills needed for music technology higher education study, and the opportunity to develop study skills to help you to succeed. You will be offered a coherent, integrated and supported year of study through which you will gain the knowledge, awareness, skills and confidence necessary for successful undergraduate study in a range of music technology-related progression routes

### Following this course

You could progress to higher education study in areas related to music technology. These may include music production, electronic music performance, music industry studies, audio recording and a range of combined and related degrees.

### Entry requirements

GCSE maths and English at grade C/4. You may be able to study these GCSEs alongside the Access to HE Diploma. The college may ask you to sit an English and, in some cases, a maths diagnostic test. You may be asked for an interview as part of the application process.

# Fashion

## Access to HE Diploma: Fashion

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**Centre:** Waterloo

**Cost:** full fee and concession £3,928

This diploma is delivered in strategic partnership with the University of the Arts: London College of Fashion and Ravensbourne University, and is for people who intend to progress to university to study for a degree in fashion. You will learn a key skills in fashion design, garment construction, pattern cutting, drawing, textiles, digital imaging and fashion photography from experienced professionals in our well-equipped studios, culminating in the creation of fully realised garments from your own original designs to be submitted for our Annual Fashion Show. For more than five years, 100% of our Access to HE: Fashion Studies students who applied through UCAS received at least one university offer and with an overall success rate over 70% for all applications, each of our students is able to choose from multiple offers.

### Following this course

You could progress to higher education continuing your studies at Morley College London with direct entry to our Fashion HND with BA (Hons) Top-up, validated by Ravensbourne University — or you could go to university.

### Entry requirements

We offer places based on portfolio and all students are expected to have a good standard of computer literacy. All applicants will be invited to participate in one of our signature virtual taster days. You will have the opportunity to experience a range of practice sessions and to present your portfolio during a personal interview. Previous experience in drawing and basic computer skills is required. Sewing or pattern cutting is helpful but not essential.

# Dougou's Story

Dougou started out on our free community development courses in craft and sewing through the children's centre where she brought her children. She then began to specialise in pattern cutting, progressing from beginners to advanced level over the next few years. After a recommendation from her tutor, she saw an opportunity to develop her skills further and enrolled on our Access to Higher Education Diploma in Fashion.

"I wanted to improve my pattern cutting, but also my sketching and design. I learned a lot of new skills on the course, like draping on the stand and garment photography, and how to make a sketchbook, which I'd never done before." And while the course has given her plenty of work skills and professional experience, including taking part in our annual catwalk show held in Emma Cons Hall, she says that the supportive staff and feeling of community with her fellow students was the highlight of her time with us: "the course was really demanding, but our teachers were always with us to give us encouragement. We were like a little family, it was lovely."

Dougou completed the Access to HE Diploma: Fashion and went on to study at the London College of Fashion.

Morley provided the strong foundations that Dougou needed to progress to the next level and her journey here came to an end. It is her story that led us to offering top-up degrees. Students with same perseverance as Dougou can now continue in the 'demanding' yet 'family' environment we offer and get their Bachelors degree.

# Art & Design

## UAL Foundation Diploma in Art & Design

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**Centre:** Waterloo

**Cost:** full fee and concession £3,384

The 19+ UAL Art Foundation Diploma at Morley College Waterloo is an intensive part-time programme of study in fine art. Expand your experience, knowledge and skills in drawing, painting, printmaking, sculpture, photography, digital media, mixed media (textiles), and contextual studies. If you've been out of education for some time or are looking to build your academic confidence and a comprehensive portfolio ahead of undergraduate or postgraduate study, this course could be the perfect next step. Our students interview at the University of the Arts and gain places at Central St Martins, Camberwell, Wimbledon and other major universities and colleges across the country including the Courtauld Institute, Goldsmiths and Middlesex University. Some students who have already studied other subjects at degree level go on to study at postgraduate level.

### Following this course

Following this course, you can progress to university to further your studies at degree level. Previous students have progressed on to reputable universities such as the University of Arts.

### Entry requirements

A Level 3 qualification and maths and English at GCSE grade 4 or above (HE applicants require English language IELTS level 5.0 or above, with at least 4.5 in reading, writing, listening and speaking.) Other relevant and equivalent qualifications are considered on an individual basis.

**Cost:** full fee and concession £3,384

### Following this course

### Entry requirements

You must have an enthusiasm for digital media and design and present a portfolio of work for evaluation at interview. Previous experience in drawing is helpful but not essential. If you are interested in developing a portfolio before completing an application, you can choose from a range of short courses in design and media at Morley to guide you on your way.

# Business

## Access to HE Diploma: Business Studies

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**Centre:** Waterloo  
**Cost:** full fee and concession £3,022

The Level 3 Access to HE Diploma in Business is a nationally recognised qualification regulated by the Quality Assurance Agency for Higher Education (QAA) which is designed to provide preparation for study in higher education in the UK for adults returning to education. Through lectures and group work, as well as written assignments and regular assessment, you will be able to master key business and management principles and gain practical skills valued by employers and higher education institutions alike, such as analytical approach, critical examination and evaluation, leadership and independent thinking.

### Following this course

You could progress to business degree courses, including economics and finance, marketing, international business, business management, music business and events management.

### Entry requirements

GCSEs in maths and English (grades A-C) or equivalent qualifications. You will need these two qualifications in addition to the Access to HE Diploma to progress to most university courses.

## **Access to HE Diploma: Business and Finance**

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**Centre:** Waterloo

**Cost:** full fee and concession £3,022

The Level 3 Access to HE Diploma in Business and Finance is a nationally recognised qualification regulated by the Quality Assurance Agency for Higher Education (QAA) which is designed to provide preparation for study in higher education in the UK for adults returning to education. Through lectures and group work, as well as written assignments and regular assessment, you will be able to master key business and management principles and gain practical skills valued by employers and higher education institutions alike, such as analytical approach, critical examination and evaluation, leadership and independent thinking.

### **Following this course**

You could progress to higher education study in areas related to business and finance. These may include some of the following areas of degree level study: accountancy, accounting and finance, banking and finance, business studies, business management, finance, international finance and a wide range of combined and related degrees.

### **Entry requirements**

GCSEs in maths and English (grades A-C) or equivalent qualifications. You will need these two qualifications in addition to the Access to HE Diploma to progress to most university courses.

# Humanities

## Access to HE Diploma: Humanities

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**Centres:** North Kensington and Waterloo

**Cost:** full fee and concession £3,022

Our Diploma course leads to nationally recognised qualifications that enable successful students to progress to degree level study at university. The programme is the most suitable route for you if you are looking to go on to study a degree in subjects as history, politics, international relations and/or development studies, sociology, and criminology. You will study core modules in study skills, which will enable you to develop the essential skills you will need to be a successful student at university, along with three modules, politics, history and sociology. You will receive extensive support throughout the course, including guidance around all aspects of your university application.

### Following this course

You could progress to study for a degree in politics and internal relations, global humanitarian studies, human geography, development studies and other similar undergraduate programmes.

### Entry requirements

GCSE English grades A-C / 4-9 or Level 2 equivalent, and GCSE maths grades A-C / 4-9 or Level 2 equivalent is desirable. You will need these two qualifications in addition to the Access to HE Diploma to progress to most university undergraduate programmes.

# Nursing & Midwifery

## Access to HE: Nursing, Midwifery & Health

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**Centre:** Waterloo

**Cost:** full fee and concession £3,384

This course provides a thorough grounding in the knowledge and skills you will need to prepare for a health-related degree. All students take modules in study skills, biology and psychology, then select one of the following options: nursing studies, midwifery studies, biochemistry (for dietetics or physiotherapy), or physics (for radiography). The timetable is designed to fit around work and childcare commitments, with daytime and evening options available (ask for our course leaflet). Applicants for degree courses in nursing, midwifery or health degree courses are expected to have significant work experience (either paid or voluntary) within a health or care environment.

### Following this course

You could progress to a degree programme in nursing (adult / children's / learning disabilities / mental health), midwifery and other health related subjects (e.g. occupational therapy, physiotherapy, nutrition, health promotion, paramedic science, radiography).

### Entry requirements

GCSEs in maths and English (grades A-C or grades 4-9) or a recognised equivalent. You will need these two qualifications in addition to the Access to HE Diploma to progress to university. We do not expect you to have any formal qualifications in science, although some prior knowledge of biology would be an advantage.

# Science

## Access to HE Diploma: Science

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**Centre:** Waterloo

**Cost:** full fee and concession £3,384

An Access to HE Diploma in Science could be your first step towards a career in science or engineering. This daytime programme provides a thorough grounding in scientific principles and practical skills in preparation for a wide range of science-based degrees, such as biomedical sciences, biochemistry, ecology, chemistry, pharmaceutical science, physics, civil, mechanical, electronic or chemical engineering, or earth science. You can select modules that match your interests and progression aim.

### Following this course

You could progress to a science-based degree course in chemistry, pharmacy, pharmaceutical science or pharmacology, biosciences or biomedical science, engineering (e.g. mechanical/civil/electrical/aeronautical/petroleum), physical sciences, earth or planetary science. This access programme also prepares students for health related degree courses in radiography, dietetics, physiotherapy and paramedic science.

### Entry requirements

GCSE maths and English at grade A-C / 4-9 or Level 2 Equivalent. You also need to have studied science at Level 2 (GCSE level).

# Medicine

## Access to HE: Medicine and Medical Biosciences

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**Centre:** Waterloo

**Cost:** full fee and concession £3,384

An Access to HE Diploma in Medicine could be your first step towards a career in areas related to medicine and medical science. This programme provides a thorough grounding in scientific principles in preparation for study in the areas of medicine or medical sciences. All students will take units in study skills, human biology, chemistry and physics.

### Following this course

You could progress to a medical science-based degree course such as medicine and dentistry. This Access programme also prepares students for degree level study in anatomy, physiology, pharmacy, pharmaceutical science or pharmacology, biosciences or biomedical science.

### Entry requirements

GCSEs in maths and English (grades A-C or grades 4-9) or a recognised equivalent. You will need these two qualifications in addition to the Access to HE Diploma to progress to university. Some universities will require a minimum of B/6 in GCSE English and maths, and there may also be the requirement to hold additional GCSE qualifications.

## Kabir’s Story

Kabir Rattu wanted to be a doctor from an early age.

Kabir originally worked in database development and architecture: “I never felt fulfilled with helping investment banks make financially beneficial decisions. That wasn’t what I wanted out of life.”

He says he wasn’t in a position to study medicine at 18. But as it turns out, he thinks he’s in a better position at 28.

That he was an adult in an existing career meant he was more focused on succeeding as he was risking more. “My career was paying very well. I was getting regular promotions and had saved up for a deposit on a house. When I made this decision, I had to step down from working full time and that money now goes towards my degree. And so I was giving up on my career progression and hopes of owning a house. Taking those risks meant the least I could do is give studying my full attention for the year.”

But the risk has paid off. He’s been accepted to attend St George’s University of London for medicine.

28 year-old Kabir was particularly appreciative of the teaching staff at Morley: “The tutors were amazing. It’s just really refreshing when you’ve got tutors who genuinely want to see you succeed and will do whatever they can to make that happen. So it was a very positive experience.”

Kabir received Morley’s Waterloo campus’ Outstanding Achievement Award for his work studying Access to Higher Education Medicine & Medical Bioscience Diploma.



### Following this course




