For beginners to gain basic knowledge and skills.

L1

To gain basic knowledge of jobs, business and industry. L1 is pre GCSE. Puts you on the path to a vocational qualification.

L2

Level 2 Intermediate

Courses include a diverse range of activities. Certificates and Diplomas for this qualification. L2 Certificate is equivalent to two GCSEs. L2 Diploma is four GCSEs.

Level 3 Advanced

Prepares you for work and higher education. More challenge, development of skills and subject knowledge.

**Level 4 & 5
Higher Education**

Equivalent to the first two years of a degree. Specialist qualification that helps move you into leadership and management.

The Higher National Certificate (HNC) is Level 4.

Level 6

Equivalent to a degree, with or without honours.

In-depth professional knowledge, including masters degrees, postgraduate or professional certificates or diplomas.



Supporting you at Morley

Morley aims to create a safe and supportive environment for all students. We have student services teams across all centres to support your wellbeing, safety and learning needs.

Wellbeing

Your health and wellbeing are important to us. We have a mental health and wellbeing team to help you if you feel stressed, anxious or overwhelmed whilst studying with us due to things that are happening in your personal life or at College.

Financial Support

There are 16-18 bursaries to help support with travel and materials. This is for accredited courses and eligibility will be based on household income.

16-18 Vulnerable Bursary

There is a Bursary up to £1,200 a year for eligible students. You need to be 16-18, on an applicable accredited course(s), in care, a care leaver, on Universal Credit and living independently or on Personal Independence Payments, as well as Universal Credit in your own right.



16-18 Discretionary Bursary

The discretionary bursary helps with materials or with travel. Eligible learners are 16-18, aged 19+ on a programme that began aged 16-18, aged 19-23 and have an EHCP. You need to be a dependant of someone with an income below £25,000 or means tested benefit.



Business

Pearson BTEC Level 2 Diploma in Business

Centre: North Kensington

Cost: free to 16-18 year-olds

You will study a total of 12 units to complete this qualification.

- Principles of Marketing - Externally assessed
- Small Business Planning

- Principles of Customer Services

Following this course: You can progress to a Level 3 qualification in Business or an apprenticeship.

Entry requirements: Four GCSEs at 3 (D) or above. Or, an appropriate qualification at Level 1. You will be expected to have a 3 (D) or above in English and maths.



Pearson BTEC Level 3 National Foundation Diploma in Business

Centre: North Kensington

Cost: free to 16-18 year-olds

We deliver the National Extended Diploma as two, one-year programmes. Year 1 is equivalent to 1.5 A Levels and Year 2 to three A Levels. You will need to successfully complete the Foundation Diploma to progress onto the second year. The Extended Diploma will be studied in the second year.

You will study seven units in Year 1.

- Exploring Business
- Developing a Marketing Campaign - Externally assessed
- Personal and Business Finance - Externally assessed

Following this course: You can progress onto a business-related degree or an HNC/D. Students can also start work in administration, finance and team leader roles.

Entry requirements: Five GCSEs at 4+ inc. maths or English or Level 2 qualification, preferably in business. Under 19s who still need GCSE maths or English 4+ will be able to study these.



IT & Computing

Level 1/Level 2 Extended Certificate in Information & Creative Technology

Centre: North Kensington

Cost: free to 16–18 year-olds

This course provides a comprehensive and challenging programme of study in information and creative technology.

You will study:

- The Online World - Externally assessed
- Technology Systems - Externally assessed
- A Digital Portfolio
- Creating Digital Graphics
- Creating Digital Video

- Mobile Apps Development
- Computer Networks
- Website Development
- IT Work Experience

Following this course: You can progress on to a Level 3 qualification in ICT and computing or an apprenticeship.

Entry requirements: Four GCSEs at 3 (D) or above. Or you have achieved an appropriate qualification at Level 1. You will be expected to have a 3 (D) or above in English and maths.

If you have not yet achieved a grade 4 at GCSE (C), you will be expected to enrol on an English and/or maths course.



BTEC Level 3 Foundation Diploma in Information Technology (Year 1)

Centre: North Kensington

Cost: free to 16-18 year-olds

You will study a range of subjects in ICT such as Information Technology Systems, Using social media in Business, Programming, Website Development and Mobile Apps Development.

Following this course: You can progress to an HNC in interactive media, an HND in engineering or to any number of similar degree courses.

Entry requirements: Four GCSEs at 4+ inc. maths or English Level 2 qualification, preferably in business. Under 19s who still need GCSE maths or English 4+ will be able to study these.



Art & Design

UAL Level 2 Diploma Art & Design

Centre: North Kensington

Cost: free to 16-18 year-olds

This hands on practical course will suit those who enjoy creating designs and artworks such as ceramics, glass, jewellery, interior and product design. You will develop drawing and creative thinking skills and learn the fundamentals of art and design to build a portfolio of work for further study or apprenticeship.

Following this course: You can progress to Level 3 courses or go on to further study in related subjects. You can seek apprenticeships or work in the industry.

Entry requirements: Four GCSEs at grade 3 or above including maths and English, or a Level 1 equivalent qualification plus a good reference.



Music

UAL Level 2 Diploma in Music Performance & Production

Centre: North Kensington

Cost: free to 16–18 year-olds

Specialise in Rap and/or Beatbox in this UK history-making course.

An eight-unit, one-year course, specially developed to provide you with the opportunity to further evolve your talent and abilities in music performance and production. Collaboration is a central theme, alongside an awareness of potential future career paths available in the creative industries.

Following this course: You could progress onto the UAL Level 3 Diploma in Creative Practice or a higher level of study in music and creative Industries.

Entry requirements: UAL or equivalent Level 1 qualification or at least three GCSEs at 3+ inc. maths or English. Under 19s who still need GCSE maths or English 4+ will be able to study these.



UAL Level 3 Diploma and Extended Diploma in Music Performance & Production

Centre: North Kensington

Cost: free to 16–18 year-olds

Diploma: One-year, eight units

Extended Diploma: Two-year, 13 units

The UAL Level 3 Diploma and Extended Diploma in Music Performance and Production has been formulated to give students the necessary skills, knowledge and understanding necessary to progress to further or higher study and training in the music and creative industries.

Following this course: You could progress onto university-level courses, or industry-based placements.

Entry requirements: A UAL or equivalent Level 2 qualification. Four GCSEs grade 3+.



Health, Social Care & Early Years

Level 2 in Health and Social Care

Centre: North Kensington

Cost: free to 16-18 year-olds

This study programme will prepare you for a career in health and social care. Potential career routes include roles such as a health care practice worker, home carer, midwife, nursing home practitioner, occupational therapist, or social worker. You will also have the opportunity to go on work experience in a health care or early years setting as part of this course.

Following this course: You can progress onto our Level 3 Health and Social Care.

Entry requirements: Four GCSEs at grade 3 or above, including maths and English. An enhanced DBS check is required before starting the course.



Level 3 in Health and Social Care

Centre: North Kensington

Cost: free to 16–18 year-olds

This two-year study programme prepares you for a variety of careers in health and social care, for example, in midwifery, nursing, social or youth work and occupational therapy. You will complete a substantial work placement in a clinical healthcare setting as part of your course.

Following this course: You can progress into higher education or find work in a healthcare setting.

Entry requirements: Four GCSEs at grade 4+, including maths and English. An enhanced DBS check is required before starting the course.

NCFE CACHE Level 3 Diploma for the Early Years Workforce (Early Years Educator)

Centre: North Kensington

Cost: free to 16–18 year-olds

This course qualifies you to work in a supervisory role within a nursery and is the minimum qualification necessary to open your own nursery. The course requires a placement in a childcare setting for 12 hours per week and you will be assessed in the workplace by a qualified assessor. You will study in detail different theories of learning that underpin the Early Years Foundation Framework and how to develop children in each of these areas, including social and emotional development and emergent literacy skills. Progress into supervisory positions and onto the Level 4 Diploma in Early Years Education.

Entry requirements: In order to be counted in ratios at Level 3 in the workplace, you must have GCSE English and maths at Grade C or above. You will need to arrange your own placement in a childcare setting and have a current DBS check.



Applied Science

Level 2 in Applied Science

Centre: North Kensington

Cost: free to 16-18 year-olds

This study programme takes a practical and applied approach in a vocational context, covering key scientific principles in biology, chemistry and physics. With a focus on practical skills, it is an engaging introduction to applied science in state-of-the-art laboratories. The skills you will learn are designed to reflect the needs of employers in science, health and life science industries.

Following this course: You can progress to related vocational qualifications at Level 3, such as applied science, forensic science and medical science.

Entry requirements: Four GCSEs at grade 3 or above, including maths and English.



Public Services

Level 2 in Public Services

Centre: North Kensington

Cost: free to 16–18 year-olds

This is a practical and assignment-based course, which covers different disciplines in public services. It is taught by staff who have worked in the police, prison and armed services, fire and rescue.

Following this course: Successful completion of this course will enable you to progress onto our Level 3 Public Services course.

Careers include emergency, security, border and prison services, Armed Forces and community leadership.

Entry requirements: Four GCSEs at grade 3 or above including maths and English.

Vocational Studies

ESOL Level 1 Introductory Diploma in Vocational Studies

This study programme is specially designed for you to explore career options alongside English and Maths qualifications. You will have an opportunity to explore a number of areas in the centre including, IT, Business, early years, health and social care, public services and an introduction to music and production skills if you are seeking to progress onto music provision.

You will learn about communicating, research skills, and developing your employability. This Diploma helps you to develop confidence and broad abilities.

Following this course: You will be able to progress to our Level 2 programmes in your chosen area of focus detailed in this prospectus.

Entry requirements: There are no formal entry requirements for level 1. Under 19s who still need GCSE maths or English will be able to study these. We will ask you to attend an interview for this course.



ReStart

ReStart: Up to Level 2

This programme is for young people who in the middle of the college year, find themselves not in education, employment or training. It is an opportunity to join us in college and to 'get back on track'. You will work with your class-mates on group projects which will help you develop confidence, teamwork and professional skills.

Following this course: You can progress to a full-time learning programme within Morley College London or be ready to progress to another provider depending upon your choice of course.

Entry requirements: There are no formal entry requirements for ReStart. Under 19s who still need GCSE maths or English will be able to study these. We will ask you to attend an interview for this course. You can join ReStart at any time from November throughout the year.

There is an extensive list to choose from such as film and media, esports and gaming, fine art, media design, fashion, photography and 3D design.



Fashion

UAL Level 3 Extended Diploma in Fashion (Design, Textiles & Communication)

Centre: Chelsea

Cost: free to 16-18 year-olds

This practical course develops technical and creative skills, such as design, illustration, fashion print, knit, weave, embroidery, styling, photo shoots and more.

Following this course: You could progress to degree courses, apprenticeships, or appropriate entry level roles within the fashion industry.

Entry requirements: At least four grade 4+ GCSEs including English or maths.

UAL Level 4 Foundation Diploma in Fashion

Centre: Chelsea

Cost: free to 16–18 year-olds

A one-year course that immerses you in all aspects of the creative processes within fashion. You will be encouraged to learn through exploration and discovery.

Following this course: Most students continue their studies on university degrees, apprenticeships, or appropriate entry level roles within the fashion industry.

Entry requirements: A Level 3 qualification and maths or English at GCSE grade 4+.





Art, Design & Media

UAL Level 1 Diploma in Art, Design & Media

Centre: Chelsea

Cost: free to 16–18 year-olds

This course is a specialist qualification written by universities and the creative industry to prepare students for advance study in this sector.

Following this course: You could progress onto the UAL Level 2 Diploma in Art and Design or another course to develop your skills in art and design.

Entry requirements: No formal requirement. Entry for the course is via an interview.



UAL Level 2 Diploma in Art and Design

Centre: Chelsea

Cost: free to 16–18 year-olds

This course is project-based, with a practical interdisciplinary approach, creating 2D and 3D objects, designs and artwork.

Following this course: You could progress onto the UAL Level 3 Diploma in Creative Practice or a higher level of study in the art and design industry.

Entry requirements: Three GCSEs grade 3+. Under 19s who still need GCSE maths or English grade 4+ will be able to study these.

UAL Level 3 Extended Diploma in Creative Practice

Centre: Chelsea

Cost: free to 16–18 year-olds

This two-year course allows students to explore art, design, sculpture, illustration, fashion and more to establish where to specialise in higher education or in a related industry.

Following this course: You can progress onto a Level 4 Foundation Diploma at Morley or go on to higher study at another organisation.

You could also consider an apprenticeship or entry level role in the creative industries.

Entry requirements: Four GCSEs grade 4+ inc. maths or English. Under 19s who still need GCSE maths or English grade 4+ will be able to study these.



UAL Level 4 Foundation Diploma in Art & Design – Art Pathway

Centre: Chelsea

Cost: free to 16–18 year-olds

This intensive one-year diagnostic Level 4 Foundation course provides you with the opportunity to explore a broad field of arts practice before committing to any one discipline.

Following this course: You can progress onto a higher education course at Morley or with another organisation.

You could also find employment in the creative industries.

Entry requirements: A Level 3 qualification and maths or English at GCSE grade 4+.



UAL Level 4 Foundation Diploma in Art & Design – Media Pathway (Film, Photography & Media)

Centre: Chelsea

Cost: free to 16–18 year-olds

This one-year course allows you to explore different forms of visual media before committing to any one discipline.

Following this course: You could apply for university, or you may become a freelancer/self-employed professional in the industry.

Entry requirements: A Level 3 qualification and maths or English at GCSE grade 4+.

UAL Level 4 Foundation Diploma in Design – 3D Design, Graphics, Illustration & Games Arts

Centre: Chelsea

Cost: free to 16–18 year-olds

This one-year course develops your skills in art, design, sculpture, illustration, fashion and more to establish where you may wish to specialise.

Following this course: On successful completion of the course, most students continue their studies on university degrees, do apprenticeships, or appropriate entry level roles within the creative industry.

Entry requirements: A Level 3 qualification and maths or English at GCSE grade 4+.





Photography

UAL Level 3 Extended Diploma in Photography

Centre: Chelsea

Cost: free to 16-18 year-olds

This is a two-year full-time course, equivalent to three A-Levels. It is designed for those who want to pursue photography and creativity.

Following this course: You could progress to our HNC Photography course, study at university, or enter the photography industry.

Entry requirements: At least four grade 4+ GCSEs including maths and English.



Esports

Level 2 Diploma in Media and Esports

Centre: Chelsea

Cost: free to 16-18 year-olds

This is an exciting media course that combines creativity, sportsmanship and digital learning. You will begin to look at genre and formats, live streaming, gaming, health, wellbeing, video editing and much more.

Following this course: You could progress onto the Level 3 Extended Diploma.

Entry requirements: Three GCSEs grade 3+. Under 19s who still need GCSE maths or English grade 4+ will be able to study these.

BTEC Level 3 Extended Diploma in Esports

Centre: Chelsea


Cost: free to 16–18 year-olds

This two-year course allows you to explore different forms of visual media before committing to any one discipline.

Following this course: You could apply for university, or you may become a freelancer/self-employed professional in the industry.

Entry requirements: A Level 3 qualification and maths or English at GCSE grade 4+. Under 19s who still need GCSE maths or English grade 4+ will be able to study these.





UAL Level 3 Extended Diploma in Games Design and Animation

Centre: Chelsea

Cost: free to 16-18 year-olds

This course enables you to make full use of all media contexts and will unleash your creativity via a range of technical tools and resources.

Following this course: You could apply for university, or you may become a freelancer/self-employed professional in the industry.

Entry requirements: Four GCSEs grade 4+ including maths or English. Under 19s who still need GCSE maths or English grade 4+ will be able to study these.

UAL Level 3 Extended Diploma in Graphics, Illustration & Games Arts

Centre: Chelsea

Cost: free to 16–18 year-olds


A two-year Level 3 course exploring the world of design. You will work towards the Diploma in year 1, and the Extended Diploma in year 2.

Following this course: You could progress on to higher education at Morley or at another organisation. You could also do an apprenticeship or find appropriate entry level roles within the industry.

Entry requirements: At least four grade 4+ GCSEs including maths or English.

T Levels are exciting new two-year qualifications for 16-19-year-olds that will follow GCSEs and are equivalent to three A Levels.

They have been developed as a clear alternative to A Levels and apprenticeships, and provide a direct pathway to employment, higher education, or higher or degree-level apprenticeships.

T Levels mix classroom learning alongside a mandatory 45-day industry work placement, directly relevant to your course. T-levels provide a practical experience with an employer, so you learn what a real career is like while you study.

T Levels are the right qualification for you if you know what job you want to do and you feel you are ready for the world of work. It is an intensive course with a substantial work placement component to develop the skills employers are looking for.

T Level Health and Science (Health focus)

Centre: North Kensington

Cost: free to 16–18 year-olds

T Levels are new two-year technical study programmes that provide you with the skills, knowledge and behaviours needed to successfully progress into skilled employment or higher-level study or training.

This T Level has been developed with input from employers in the health and science sector, to ensure it meets the needs of the sector and supports your preparation for work or study in the health and science sector.

It will include a core element of study and a specialist component, alongside an industry placement (420 hours) with an employer.

Core Content:

- Working within health and science
- Human health
- Safety and environmental regulations
- Managing information and data

- Good scientific and clinical practice
- Core science concepts

Specialisms in the Health and Science T Level include:

- Supporting the adult nursing team
- Supporting the Midwifery Team
- Supporting the Mental Health Team
- Supporting the care of children and young people
- Supporting the therapy teams

Following this course: You can progress to higher level study at university or into employment.

Entry requirements: You should hold a minimum of five GCSEs at grade 5 or above, including English, maths, and a science.
