What Level?

Qualifications are measured in levels. Identifying where you are helps to work out the routes you can take in your chosen vocation, and what level you need to achieve for the work you want. If you don't have any formal qualifications, an assessment will match you to the right course.

Here's a guide to help:



For beginners to gain basic knowledge and skills.



L1 is pre GCSE. Puts you on the path to a vocational qualification.



Courses include diverse range of activities. Certificates and Diplomas for this qualification. L2 Certificate is 2 GCSEs. L2 Diploma is four GCSEs.



Prepares you for work and higher education. More challenge, development of skills and subject knowledge.



Equivalent to the first two years of a degree. Specialist qualification that helps move you into leadership and management.

The Higher National Certificate (HNC) is Level 4.



Equivalent to a degree, with or without honours.



In-depth professional knowledge, including master's degrees, postgraduate or professional certificates or diplomas.

Your safety

How to fund your course

Eligible students on our higher education courses can apply for Maintenance loans, the Childcare Grant and the Adult Dependent Grant (in addition to tuition fee loans). You will need to apply directly to Student Finance England for these loans.

Learning Support

Support for those with disabilities or learning difficulties is via a government grant called the Disabled Students Allowance (DSA). You should make this application at the same time you apply for student finance. You can also contact the Additional Learning Support team before your course begins so that we can discuss any adjustments you might require on your course.

Our Entry Requirements

To apply and be accepted onto one of our higher education courses, you will need to have 48 UCAS points (or equivalent), which is achieved through:

- Access to Higher Education Diploma
- A Levels
- BTEC at Level 3

With GCSE English grade 4 or C minimum; GCSE maths is desirable.

You will need to attend an interview with a member of the teaching team who can discuss the course and its requirements with you, so you can make informed decisions.

On some courses, you may be required to bring a portfolio of work or attend an audition for example. Please check with the college beforehand, to confirm any additional entry requirements.

Mature students

If you do not meet the entry requirements as outlined above, we may still consider your application based on previous employment or previous study. We appreciate that mature students may have extensive relevant experience gained through paid or unpaid work, or through other types of professional training or sectorrelated opportunities and this experience may be used to support an application.


Danielle Kalinovskis

Ceramics

Higher National Certificate (HNC) Ceramics

Centre: Waterloo Centre **Cost:** £6,165 per year

Higher National Diploma (HND) Ceramics

Centre: Waterloo Centre **Cost:** £6,165 per year

On our HNC and HND Ceramics course you will develop a wide range of practical clay construction, mould making and digital design skills, inspired and guided by a team of subject specialist tutors who are all industry practitioners.

Our small group sizes offer students maximum contact time with tutors, fostering opportunity for each student to push the boundaries of personal creativity. The twoyear course concludes with an end of year exhibition in the Morley College Gallery in addition to a launch at New Designers. There is a regular program of diverse visiting artists and designers that act to demonstrate the multiple professional trajectories that are possible once graduating. Throughout the course there is a strong focus on professional development, fostering the vital skills that enable students to build a career in the creative industries.





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BA (Hons) Fashion Design^{*}

Centre: Waterloo Centre **Cost:** £6,165 per year

Through this course we propose an alternative future for fashion. One that rejects boundaries of gender, 'typical' fashion culture and wasteful and exploitative fashion systems. With a curriculum designed to question the current inherited practice and value systems in fashion education and the industry at large, our BA (Hons) Fashion Design seeks to create fashion innovators who eschew a standard approach and instead create and design new processes to address the challenges of waste, inclusion, and environment faced within the industry. We invite our students to re-design design itself.

This alternative vision is tactile, three dimensional, human centred and empathetic. It is agile, responsive and encourages uncompromising quality. Radical creativity, imagination and innovation are at the heart of all our practice, led by our team of industry professionals, in keeping with our five guiding principles of design:

- Human-Centred
- Innovative Design
- Inventive Method
- Ethically Produced
- Respectful of Planetary Boundaries

BA (Hons) Music Performance

BA (Hons) Music Production

Music is very closely tied to our history and tradition at Morley, from our connections to classical composers such as Gustav Holst to our respected choirs, jazz bands and orchestra. Our BA (Hons) in Music offers a practical pathway into the music industry as either a performer or within a production role. The three-year degree provides a wide theoretical and practical grounding across all the key areas of music performance and production with practical hands-on training in Music Performance, Recording and Engineering, Instrumental Technique, Applied Music Theory and Music Event Management in addition to covering theoretical topics including the Music Industry, Professional Development, Marketing & Promotion and Music & Society.

The final year offers a range of units including thought provoking exploration into musical philosophy and research, expansion of your creative ideas in sound art or technological performance and advanced technical work in your chosen discipline. You will gain experience in collaborative work with college projects including with Morley Radio, Morley's TERM Records or with external partners. Most importantly you will determine the nature of your major research and creative projects, allowing you to shape your course and the direction of your future career whilst being mentored by a team of expert tutors.

Interim awards are available after one and two years, and for those students who have already gained an HND, Foundation Degree or DipHE qualification, the final year can be joined as a 'top-up' to work towards a full degree.

Millinery

Higher National Certificate (HNC) Millinery (part time)

Centre: Chelsea Centre **Cost:** £3,235 per year (part-time for each year)

This two-year part-time programme is for students with good existing millinery skills who wish to pursue a career in millinery. The HNC in Millinery has been training industry-leading milliners for 20 years. Students on this course progress into all areas of millinery – couture fashion millinery, commercial design, theatrical and film millinery – some students have progressed on to MA level courses at leading fashion colleges. The course has close industry links with The British Hat Guild, Fenwick Bond Street, and the Worshipful Company of Feltmakers, all of whom provide career developing support and opportunities for HNC students during the course. Former students are employed by the UK's leading milliners and have quickly established themselves in their chosen field.

The tutors on the HNC course are all professional milliners as well as tutors. They bring a wealth of diversity, skills and ideas to the course, and to the development of different career pathways for each student.

Fine Art

Higher National Certificate (HNC) Fine Art

Centre: Chelsea Centre **Cost:** £6,165 per year

Higher National Diploma (HND) Fine Art

Centre: Chelsea Centre **Cost:** £6,165 per year

The Higher National qualifications in Fine Art (HNC and HND) offer you the opportunity to specialise and refine your professional practice in a supportive and stimulating environment. You will be allocated a dedicated studio space and will be coached, challenged, and supported to extend your technical skills and strengthen your body of work. You will take part in guided visits to exhibitions and will experience a broad range of workshop demonstrations to help you build the skills needed to successful complete the course, and develop your individualised practice in the HND. The HNC is a one-year course followed by the HND (two years in total).

Fine Art

BA (Hons) Fine Art (Top Up)

Centre: Chelsea Centre

Cost: £6,165 per year

The BA (Hons) Fine Art top-up degree programme has been designed for students who have successfully completed a HND or FDA Foundation degree in a relevant subject and now wish to convert their existing qualification into a full BA (Hons) qualification in the heart of London. The BA (Hons) Fine Art programme will develop your art practice alongside building your professional skills which encourages an ambitious, critically engaged practice.







Photography

Higher National Certificate (HNC) Photography (part-time)

Centre: Chelsea Centre

Cost: £3,235 per year

The HNC photography offers students in-depth practical explorations into current photographic practices, as well as advanced skills in studio lighting and post-production techniques. It is a Level 4 course equivalent to first year university and is designed to provide the skills that are needed to break into the photography industry. During the course. which is delivered over two years (part-time), students have plenty of opportunities to explore a wide range of subject areas such as fashion, portraiture, documentary, editorial and commercial photography that allows them to discover the area of photography they wish to pursue. This is a current Association of Photographers (AOP) accredited course, that offers all students a free AOP student membership for the duration of their studies.

Higher National Diploma (HND) Photography (part-time)

Centre: Chelsea Centre

Cost: £3,235 per year

The HND Photography has an emphasis on professional practice and the creation of a strong portfolio. Students gain advanced skills in studio lighting, digital post-production, alternative processes and Black & White darkroom printing, and acquire great experience in planning and managing ambitious photography projects. This is a Level 5 course equivalent to second year university and is for those students that have successfully completed a HNC in Photography, or relevant subject. It is a course that offers students a place to create innovative images and communicate thought-provoking concepts, while establishing themselves as photographers, in the rapidly evolving industry. The HND is delivered on a part-time basis over two years.

Photography

BA (Hons) Photography Top Up (part-time)

Centre: Chelsea Centre

Cost: £3,235 per year

Our BA top-up will offer a unique opportunity to develop your individual creative practice and build excellent industry standard photography skills. By exploring more adventurous and experimental outcomes on the margins of traditional and digital photography, you will extend your critical understanding which will allow you to develop your creativity and produce inspiring photographic work. This is a Level 6 programme for those who have successfully completed a HND in Photography, or relevant subject and wish to to achieve a BA honours qualification. The course is delivered on a part-time basis over two years.



Graphic Design & Illustration

Higher National Certificate (HNC) in Graphic Design & Illustration

Centre: Chelsea Centre **Cost:** £6,165 per year

The HNC and HND in Art & Design (Graphic Design & Illustration) at Morley College Chelsea Centre for the Creative Industries are full-time courses comprised of one year for the HNC and two years for the HND, designed to provide students with a broad ranging experience of these ever-evolving subject areas.

The courses are aimed at those who wish to work as professional graphic designers or Illustrators. This industry has exhibited growth over the past five years, especially in areas such as digital advertising, website design and digital design services. This course will help you to develop and extend your creative practice as a designer by providing you with a wide range of experiences such as working with clients, exhibiting your work, engaging

with industry focused projects and competitions.

You will study graphics and illustration related techniques, contextual studies, typography, packaging and printmaking during the level 4 HNC course. The level 5 HND will include opportunities to explore professional practice, web design, art direction, branding and identity. You will work towards an end of year exhibition at our Chelsea centre. You will be supported via tutorials and regular contact with the course team. Delivery is complemented by visiting speakers, industry input, live client briefs, engagement with national competitions and presentations.

Tailoring & Streetwear

The HNC and HND in Tailoring & Streetwear at Morley College Chelsea Centre for the Creative Industries are fulltime courses comprised of one year for the HNC and two years for the HND. This course is one of the few Tailoring courses in London. Our focus is on contemporary tailoring and street wear trends. You will get a fusion of traditional and contemporary skills. As a close-knit community, we will support you in small class sizes. There is a strong focus on technical skills, delivered by experienced and highly qualified tutors with traditional and contemporary industry experience .This course can lead to employment within the fashion and tailoring industry where these skills are in demand.

Foundation Degree in Early Years

This Sector-Endorsed Foundation Degree in Early Years (SEFDEY) approved course combines academic study with work-based learning. The course covers a wide range of critical and contemporary issues in the field of education and other related sectors. You will examine theoretical and practice based knowledge to support approaches to working with children from birth to five years of age in a variety of settings. This course combines work-based practice with theoretical knowledge, covering a wide range of perspectives and current issues in the field of education and other related sectors, relevant for those working in early years settings. It provides a route into higher education for experienced and committed early years practitioners, enabling you to progress from level 3 to a foundation degree.
